As You Go

These are simple questions to ask your students as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

.02 WHY ARE CONSEQUENCES AN IMPORTANT PART OF OUR LIVES? HOW MIGHT GOD USE CONSEQUENCES TO HELP US GROW?

Family Devotion

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

Summary: Exodus 32:1-14

This week we read of how Moses came down from Mount Sinai and found the Israelites worshipping a golden calf. Their rebellion was serious and revealed that they were in a bad place spiritually. Thankfully, however, they served a gracious God who listened to the prayer of Moses who cried out to God on their behalf. When we worship anyone or anything other than the one true God, we are rebelling against Him.

Discussion Questions

.01 SIN IS SERIOUS, YET WE TRY TO DOWNPLAY IT. HOW CAN WE TAKE SIN IN OUR LIVES MORE SERIOUSLY THIS WEEK?

.02 WHAT ARE SOME THINGS THAT YOUR FRIENDS PUT BEFORE GOD? WHAT DO YOU TEND TO PLACE MORE VALUE ON THAN GOD?

Pray: Humbly come before God and ask Him to reveal any idols in your heart or life. Ask Him to give you an undivided heart for Him as you go about school and other activities this week.
